Ward 7C Logan Hospital Graduate Nursing Program

Unit Overview

Ward 7C is a 32 bed Medical Inpatient Unit that specialises in Respiratory Medicine. We receive a broad range of medical conditions that include COPD, asthma, bronchiectasis, respiratory failure (type 1 and type 2), pneumonia, DKA, delirium, cognitive impairment, tracheostomy patients and treatments such a non-invasive ventilation – Bi-Level and CPAP, high flow nasal therapy and high FiO2 high flow therapy.

7C cares for high acuity patients and can accommodate up to six NIV patients. Patients are usually admitted from the Emergency Department but can also be transferred from ICU and other inpatient units.

Ward 7C also cares for other general medical conditions and can have outliers from other units – such as renal, gastroenterology, palliative. The single rooms often will have infectious diseases patients in them that have a multi resistant organisms/ COVID/TB and other airborne diseases.

2025 Graduate Program Overview

Orientation: 4 days of hospital orientation to familiarise yourselves with the hospital environment. 3 supernumerary days on the ward when you will work with a senior RN and have chance to learn workflows.

Specialist Training: ward specific training includes High Flow Oxygen, ICC, Telemetry

Study Days: there are 4 Graduate study days a year. There is also the opportunity to attend other relevant workshops within the hospital, including Cardio-Respiratory, Tracheostomy, Stroke, PIVC, Cognitive Impairment.

Unit Support: We have a ward CF who can support you along with the Graduate CF's. our CN's and senior RN's are very experienced and invested in supporting new graduates.

Shifts: all shifts are worked in a roster that promotes work-life balance.

Rotations: 6-month rotation plan that allows graduates to experience a range of clinical settings to expand their clinical knowledge and experiences.
