

Call for abstracts

Abstract submission for this Symposium is now officially open. This symposium aims to highlight recent advances in AI as applied to health service delivery, including both clinical and non-clinical applications. The Symposium is a free, in-person event only and all accepted presenters will need to register their attendance by Friday 28th February via Eventbrite (registrations open Tuesday, January 20th, 2025).

Please use the template below to submit your abstract. Submissions will be reviewed and assessed according to their clarity of academic writing, the level of maturity of the AI application being presented, and its potential or observed impact on care delivery. Either oral or poster presentations can be submitted, although the number of accepted oral presentations will be limited, and these will be no longer than 10 minutes (8 mins presentation; 2 mins for questions) with a maximum of 12 slides.

Introduction: One or two sentences explaining the clinical (or other) importance of the study question.

Aims: State the precise objective or study question addressed. If there is more than one objective, the main objective should be indicated, and only key secondary objectives stated.

Methods: Describe the basic study design, setting, participants, AI application, main outcome measure(s) and statistical analysis.

Results: Summary of study participants, key demographics, key study outcomes reported, including numerical results where possible.

Conclusions and Relevance: Provide only conclusions supported by the study results, acknowledge limitations, and provide a statement of relevance indicating implications or next steps for further development or application.

The abstract must not exceed 250 words. All text should begin following the heading on the same line. Do not change margins, font, size or any other setup on this template. The abstract should be left-and right-justified with single line spacing. The abstract should be typed in Calibri 11 point. Include the first author's surname and initial in the title of the abstract file. Please underline the presenting author in the list of author names.

Please submit your abstract by **COB Friday 14th February 2025** to ian.scott@health.qld.gov.au and indicate your preference for oral or poster. Submissions will be notified of their acceptance as an oral or poster by COB Wednesday 19th February, 2025 and receive instructions regarding preparing their presentations which will need to be forwarded to the event organiser no later than COB Friday 28th February, 2025.
