Under the Public Health Regulation 2018, medical officers are required to notify specific conditions on provisional or clinical diagnosis .

## NOTIFY BY PHONE WITHOUT DELAY

- Australian bat lyssavirus (ABLV) potential exposure (bat bite or scratch in Australia)
- Measles
- Plague
- Rabies potential exposure (bite or scratch from terrestrial mammals including bats in rabies enzootic countries)
- Smallpox
- Suspected deliberate contamination or infection with:
  - anthrax,
  - botulism (food-borne),
  - plague,
  - smallpox,
  - tularaemia.
- Viral haemorrhagic fever (Crimean-Congo, Ebola, Lassa fever, Marburg)

## NOTIFY BY PHONE 0830-2100

(OUTSIDE THESE HOURS  
VIA EMAIL)

- Avian influenza
- Ciguatera poisoning
- Diphtheria
- Haemophilus influenzae type b invasive disease (HiB)
- Haemolytic Uraemic Syndrome (HUS)
- Meningococcal disease
- Middle East respiratory syndrome (MERS)
- Severe acute respiratory syndrome (SARS)

- Adverse event following vaccination
- Acute flaccid paralysis
- Acute viral hepatitis
- Acute rheumatic fever
- COVID-19
- Creutzfeldt-Jakob disease
- Dengue
- Food or water-borne illness in a food handler
- Food or water-borne illness in 2 or more related cases
- Pertussis
- Rheumatic heart disease
- Tetanus
- Tuberculosis
- Zika
