Unit overview

The Acute Mental Health Inpatient Services provide care to people who are experiencing an acute episode of their mental illness. If a person is admitted to an acute inpatient unit, it is often because their mental illness is not manageable in a less restrictive setting, such a community-based support.

Our acute mental health inpatient units include gender specific wards, and adolescent, adult and older persons units. Services are located at Princess Alexandra, Logan, and Redland Hospitals.



Program overview

The Transition to Practice Mental Health Program provides nurses the opportunity to develop postgraduate knowledge and skills to provide person centred mental health nursing within a recovery-orientated and trauma informed framework.

The program includes a blended curriculum of clinical and self-directed learning, clinical workshops, and reflective practice over twelve months.

Support for practical learning is provided by our Nurse Educators, Clinical Facilitators, Preceptors and clinicians.
