About the Transplant Unit

- The Transplant Unit is a 14-bed ward with dedicated groups of health care professionals who provide the highest level of quality care for both transplant recipients and their families.
- The unit provides excellent care to patients undergoing kidney and liver transplantation and post-transplant care. The unit has excellent clinical outcomes for graft survival and is comparable to other world leading transplant units.
- The unit provides services to adult patients undergoing renal transplantation from living donors, brain dead donors (DBD), deceased cardiac donors (DCD), blood group ABO incompatible donors and Paired Kidney Exchange donors. The liver transplant service utilises DBD and DCD donors.
- Ward 4B Transplant is the largest kidney / liver transplant unit in Australia and the only kidney and liver transplant unit in Queensland.
- On average we perform 195 renal transplants and 60 liver transplants per year.
- We participate in international trials.
