Unit information

Ward 4C is a 28-bed acute general surgical ward at the Princess Alexandra Hospital (PAH), Brisbane. This unit provides a tertiary specialty service in Hepato-Pancreato-Biliary (HPB) surgery and Acute Surgical (ASU) admissions.

It is a high acuity unit which provides specialised services to patients requiring surgery and management of the diseases of the liver, pancreas and biliary tree, as well as those who have experienced a traumatic event or emergency thoracic and abdominal surgeries that present to the Emergency department.

Types of patients

Hepato-pancreato-biliary conditions:

- Liver and pancreatic cancer
- Pancreatitis (gallstone or alcohol induced)
- Obstructive jaundice
- Neuro-endocrine tumours
- General surgery
- Liver resections
- Whipples

Acute Surgical conditions:

- Hernia repair
- Laparotomy
- Laparoscopic cholecystectomy
- Bowel resections
- Distal pancreatectomy
- Splenectomy

Graduate nurse skills

- Care for complex surgical and trauma patients
- Manage post-operative patients with PCA and epidural analgesia
- Manage a variety of drainage systems
- Manage fluid regimes and intravenous infusions including parenteral nutrition
- · Care of the palliative patient

- Wound management
- Attend weekly ward-based in-services
- Attend fortnightly ward meetings
