Types of patients

Ward 4E care for many different types of patients with a variety of Gastroenterology, Hepatology and some colorectal conditions. Some of these conditions include:

- · Gastro-intestinal bleeding
- Inflammatory bowel disease
- Intestinal failure
- Acute / chronic cirrhosis
- Hepatitis / liver failure
- Hepatocellular carcinoma
- Variety of colorectal surgeries

Graduate nurse skills to acquire

- Care of the hepatology patient including cirrhosis, encephalopathy and hepatorenal syndrome
- Management of patients undergoing TIPPS/ TACE/ POEM / ERCP/ Paracentesis procedures
- Interventional endoscopy management for variceal bleeds
- Care of the inflammatory bowel disease patient
- Care of Ileostomies and colostomies
- Management of Parenteral Nutrition (PN)
- Liver transplant workup
