Midwifery Services at Logan and Beaudesert Hospitals

Unit Overview

Logan is in one of the fastest growing regions in Queensland.

Logan Hospital is currently a 425-bed secondary teaching hospital that is undergoing expansion to accommodate the needs of its growing community. Logan Hospital strives to provide excellence, innovation and leadership in healthcare for every woman, baby and family, every time. This encompasses family-centred care and incorporates quality, evidenced-based and culturally safe care by supported and engaged staff.

The Logan Hospital Maternity Services operates as a comprehensive Level 4 service as defined in the Clinical Service Capability Framework (CSCF) for Public and Licences Private Health Facilities version 3.2 (Queensland Government, 2019). These services include antenatal, intrapartum and postnatal care services. The service utilises a shared governance structure with Midwifery & Nursing Director of Women's and Children's Services and Director of Obstetrics. Logan Maternity and Neonatal services has partnerships and coordination of care with the tertiary centres.

Midwifery at Logan Hospital

Logan Hospital cares for approximately 3900 mothers and babies a year. Logan hospital cares for women with complex needs and women from diverse cultures.

Midwifery at Beaudesert Hospital

A rural facility with two birthing rooms and four maternity beds, caring for approximately 300 mothers and babies a year who are primarily low risk.

Graduate placement opportunities

Work across maternity areas with rotations to various maternity areas:

- Antenatal Clinic
- Birth Suites and Maternity Assessment Centre
- Maternity Inpatient Unit
- Special Care Nursery

Opportunities are available to have a rotation of 1-2 months at Beaudesert Hospital.

Midwifery group practice

An opportunity for a graduate to work within the Midwifery Group Practice Model of care working across the continuum of maternity for the graduate year supported by experienced midwives working within the model.
